TO: Anne Pastore a resident of the Town of Otisfield, County of Oxford, and State of Maine.
~~In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the~~
~~inhabitants of the Town of Otisfield, qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the~~
Otisfield Community Hall on State Route 121, in said Town, on June 27, 2020 at 9:00 in
the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Article 1 To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Article 2 To choose a Selectmen/Assessor/Overseer of the Poor for a three-year term.
- Article 3 To choose a Chairman of the Board of Selectmen/Assessors/Overseers of the Poor for the ensuing year.
- Article 4 To choose a Road Commissioner or act otherwise for the ensuing year.
- Article 5 To see if the Town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit established for Otisfield by State law in the event that the municipal budget approved under the following articles will result in a tax commitment that is greater than that property tax levy limit. Note: A vote on this article requires a written ballot.

The present Squad, a 2001 GMC Van~~ is not four-wheel drive and does not have the gross vehicle rating weight (GVRW) to accommodate the current equipment nor allow for future growth. The squad contains equipment, tools, and supplies necessary in responding to all emergencies. The Otisfield Volunteer Firefighters Association would provide \$30,000 toward this purchase and \$30,000 would be taken from the Timber Reserve Fund, (current balance \$143,316).

thereon, on such terms as they may deem advisable and to execute quit claim deeds for such property, to use excess funds from the sale of tax acquired property to maintain town owned property and negotiate contracts for snow-removal-and-sanding.

- B. To fix a date when taxes are due and payable and to fix a rate of interest to be charged on taxes unpaid after that date and set an interest rate that the town will pay on rebated taxes for the fiscal year.
- C. For the Tax Collector to accept prepayment of taxes not yet due or assessed.




